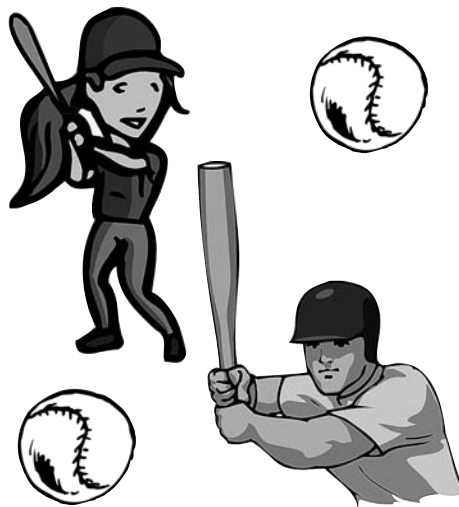

Printmaking, grades 11/12: 3rd place, Shannon Kelley; Honorable Mention, Brittany Baumert

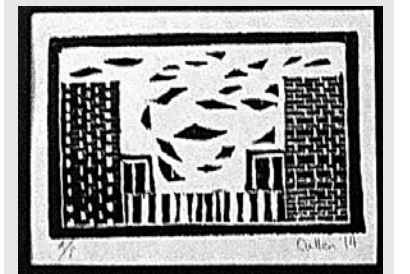
