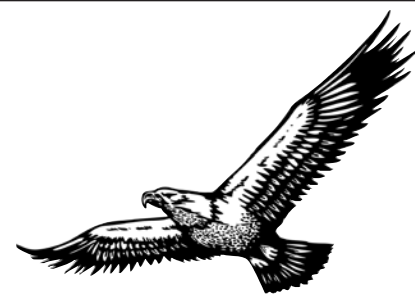

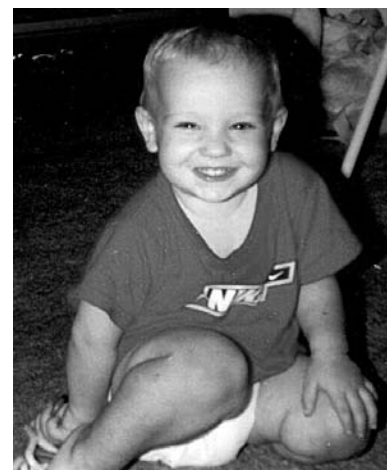
Outside of school work, Dylan takes part in what he enjoys doing most: working on cars. Although Dylan currently has no wheels,

KHS wishes him well and the best of luck on this journey.

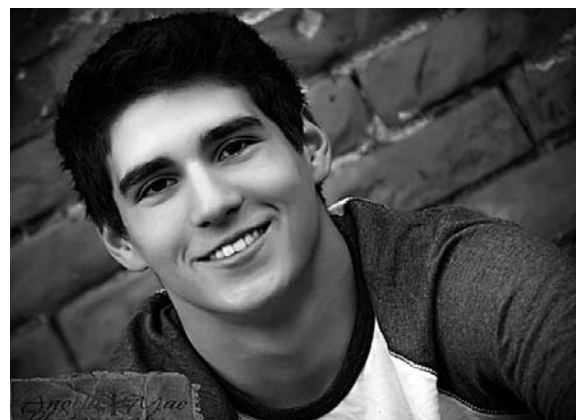

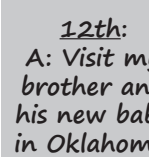
