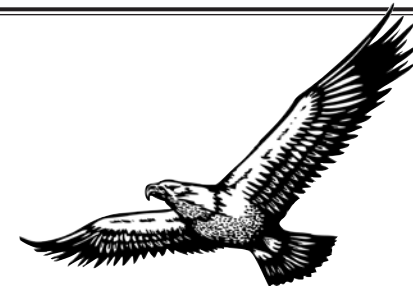

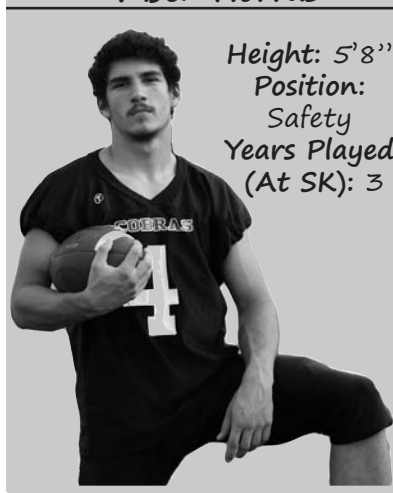

Callie Greiner commented, "As a team, we have really good chemistry because we have played together since the beginning. Abby

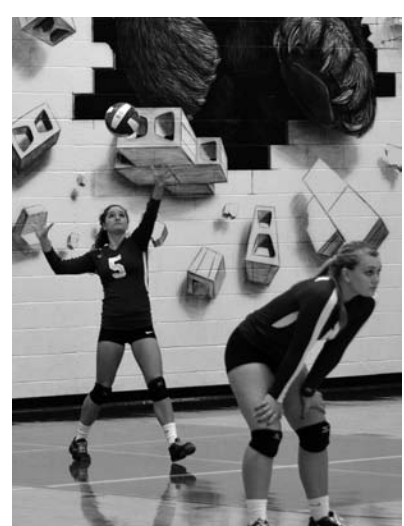
