

Editor's Note: Since this article was written, all schools in Iowa have closed, along with most other businesses. As of Sunday, March 29, Iowa health officials had confirmed 336 positive cases of coronavirus and four deaths in the state. Nationwide. there were 122,653 cases and 2,112 deaths. Social distancing guidelines have been issued to limit gatherings

to less than 10 people. MARCH 11, 2020 - The coronavirus has been something that is being taken very seriously worldwide. This has caused many people around the world to be in an uproar. The pandemic began in China, then moved on to surrounding countries and then on to the United States. There have been a total of 1,215 cases of coronavirus confirmed in the U.S. total, with a total of 14 confirmed cases in Iowa alone. This outbreak has caused many to act in a state of panic, including the cancellations of different tournaments and sporting events across the country. Many of the colleges and universities in Iowa have announced that they will be transferring students to online classes due to the upcoming spring break. The first individual to be treated for the coronavirus in Iowa was being treated at the University of Iowa Hospital. So far in there have been 41 deaths in the U.S., mostly among the elderly population and those with underlying health conditions. Social distancing is being encouraged and many large gatherings have already been cancelled.


