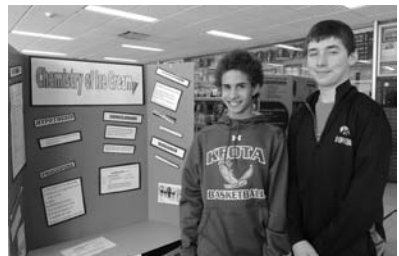

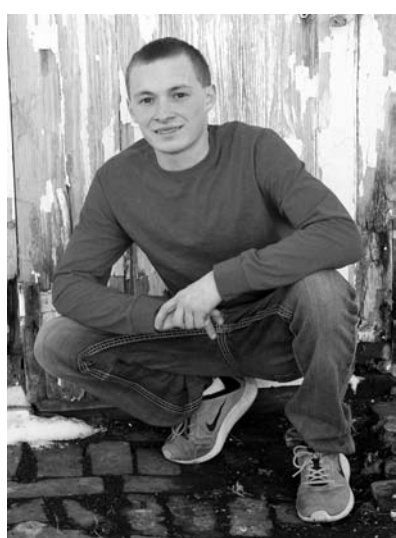

## JUNIOR HIGH SCIENCE FAIR A RESOUNDING SUCCESS

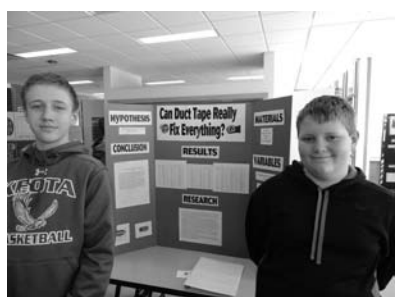

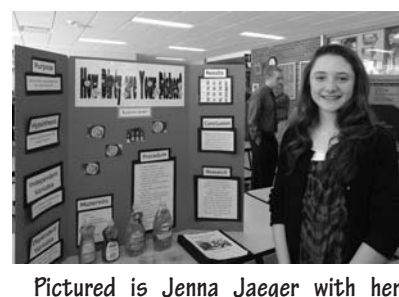

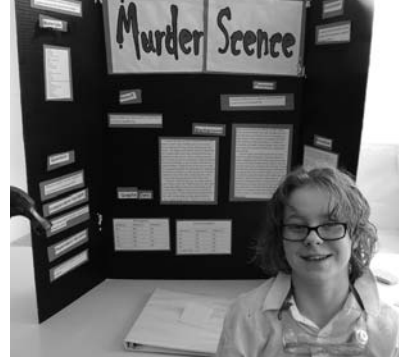

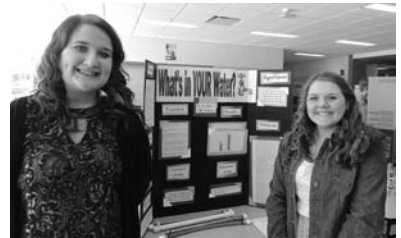

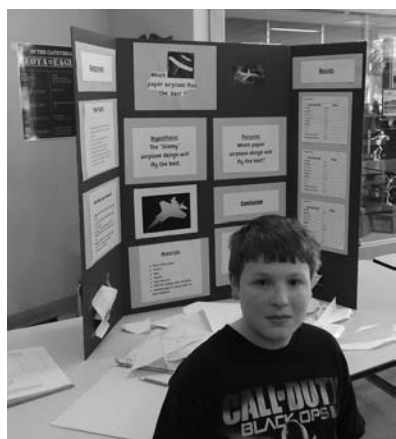

Pictured is Lexi Purkypile with her project "Blah, Blah, Rah, Rah!" Lexi placed first in the Best Use of Data category.



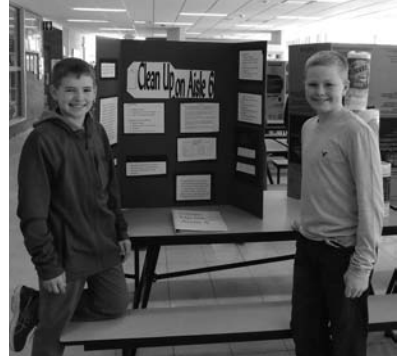
Pictured are Sky Weber and Callie McNurlen with their project "What's in Your Water?" This dynamic duo won second place for Best Use of Data.



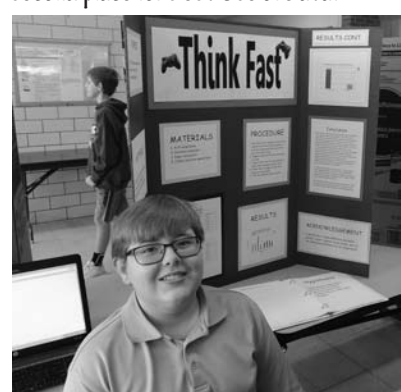

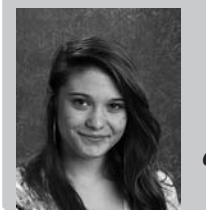
