SOILS TEAM GOES TO STATE

The Keota Varsity Soil Evaluation team is off to a great start this 2016 season, placing first as a team at the Quad-County Soil Evaluation competition. Junior Riley Conrad placed first individually, followed closely by Marty Baker (Junior), Avery Conrad (Senior), and Cole Brenneman (Junior). Joe Swanstrom (Freshman) was also very successful competing in the junior division at the Quad-County competition, where he placed first overall as an individual. With the first place varsity ranking, Keota easily moved on to the District competition in Muscatine, Iowa.

The District competition was a step up from the Quad-County competition, but the Keota team was well prepared and ended up placing third out of twenty-eight total teams. Riley Conrad led the team placing fifth overall, followed by Marty Baker in ninth, Joe Swanstrom in thirteenth, and Avery Conrad in eighteenth. These placings easily advanced them on to the State competition in Ames, Iowa on Oct. 8.

At 4:30 a.m. on a Saturday morning, the Keota Soil Evaluation team left for the State competition up in Ames, Iowa. First, they took the state soils test, followed by the soil

evaluation portion of the competition. With high expectations, the Keota Soil Evaluation team then went on to the Awards Ceremony, where they received a Gold rating and 11th place in the state of Iowa. They were proud of these results, since this was an improvement over last year.
