



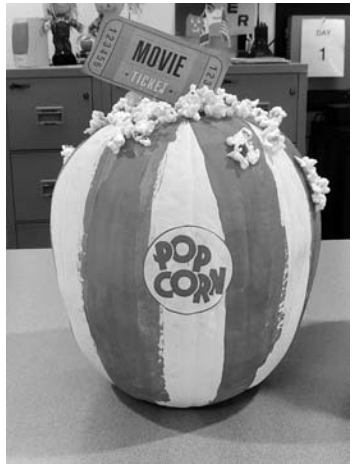

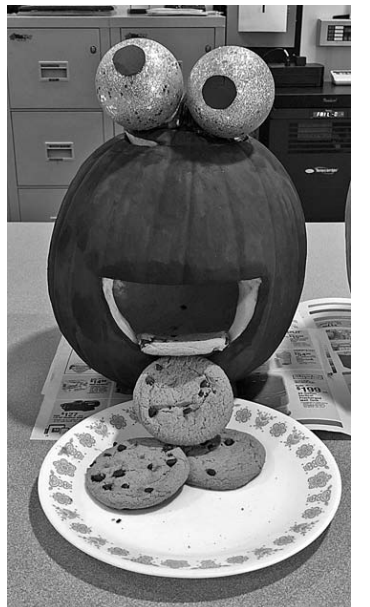
STUDENT COUNCIL SPONSORS PUMPKIN DECORATING CONTEST

Q: If all electronics died tomorrow, which one would you miss the most and why?

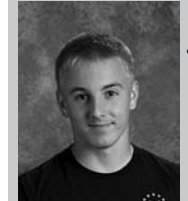
