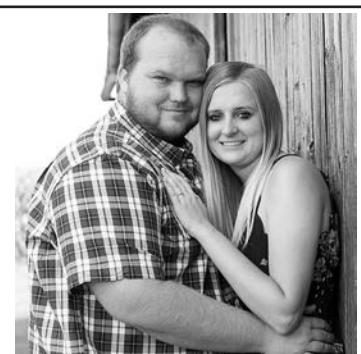
high school is being able to see her friends every day, and she also misses her teachers that were involved in preparing her to succeed in the future.
