Anthony likes going to Keota High School because

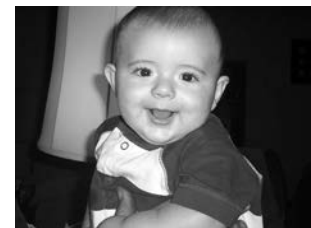

Q: What are you looking forward to this fall and why?

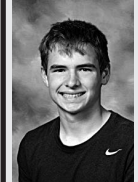
